ly-disabled workers	gram. With the closer coordination with hospitals, assistance to workers who sustained injuries, contracted sickness or died while performing their duties can now be provided immediately.
	Based on the commitments of hospitals, they will provide the ECC with immediate information on emergency admissions and out-patient cases in- volving workers who sustained injuries or contracted sickness while working.
	In turn, the ECC will right away conduct visits to the patients in the hospi- tals. In this way, the ECC can provide psychosocial counselling, if needed, and facilitate the provision of information to claim EC benefits.
	"It is the ECC's mandate to protect the rights of workers and promote their welfare, thus, we tapped the best hospitals all over the Philippines to provide us with information in case of work-related contingencies," ECC Ex- ecutive Director Stella Zipagan-Banawis said.
	The following hospitals have so far pledged their commitment to the ECC and consequently, to ODWs: AFP Medical Center, Amang Rodriguez Memo- rial Medical Center, Capitol Medical Center, Cardinal Santos Medical Cen- ter, VRP Medical Center, Jose R. Reyes Memorial Medical Center, Novalich- es General Hospital, Ospital Ng Maynila, Philippine Orthopedic Center, Rizal Medical Center, San Juan De Dios Hospital, St. Luke's Medical Center (Q.C.), Philippine General Hospital, Quezon City General Hospital, Metro- politan Medical Center and PNP General Hospital.
	Banawis added that the ECC continues to negotiate with other hospitals nationwide to make sure that patients with work-connected contingencies can be immediately assisted.
	"This initiative is one of the ECC's ways of reaching out to those who need assistance and to the workers who are in their most vulnerable condi- tion. We do not wait for those who are in need to come to us, we go to them," Banawis shared.

Machine operator bounces back from setback through the help of the ECC

January 29, 2014 was an ordinary working day for Bryan Anthony Cortes; he went to work and started operating the mixing roll machine in a manufacturing company. However, the ordinary day turned into a nightmare for Cortes when his right thumb was caught by the chain of the machine which caused its amputation.

Since it was a work-related incident, Cortes was able to receive rehabilitation services from ECC which consist of eight physical therapy sessions worth P3,200 and a high definition silicone finger worth P30,000.

Right after he got his free artificial finger from the Employees' Compensation Commission, his days returned to regular working days once again. Cortes was able to get his old job back as a machine operator.

"The ECC, as a government agency that provides meaningful and appropriate compensation to workers in the event of work-related contingencies, would like to reach out to all the occupationally-disabled workers to help them improve their lives after the work-related incident," ECC Executive Director Stella Zipagan-Banawis shared.

Banawis added that ECC understands that it is very hard for workers who were injured from work to recover from a particular unfortunate event in their lives. Hence, the ECC continues to initiate programs for the ODWs to help them improve the quality of their lives.
